LANJ to Play Major Role in Crafting Legislation and Developing Federal Enforcement Plan

This past July there was a terrible tragedy in which an 8 month old baby was killed by a Jitney-Bus in West New York State. State and Federal officials were outraged by this horrific accident.

LANJ has been asked by the NJ Assembly and Senate to work with the Office of Legislative Services to create new language to amend the bi-partisan A3993 (Jitney Legislation) to ensure that there is enforcement of the law through "probable cause" and by all local, county, state (including state police, Port Authority, NJ Transit), fines are significant enough to make a difference. They will use the limo law as a guide with fines starting at \$1500 for first offense, make sure vehicles are properly inspected twice a year and carry the required insurance, to include that drivers have CDLs and have had criminal background checks. Owners of jitney-buses that lease or rent their vehicles will be required to pay the same fine as the driver for any of the offenses. A "hotline" number will be on the side of the vehicles in which citizens can call in complaints.

The Atlantic City Jitneys will be subject to the above and additionally the loopholes that they have been using to conduct charter or pre-arranged service will be dealt with directly in the amended version of A3993 (Mainor, Jiminez, Caride and Rudder) and the new Senate bill to be introduced in September by Senators Sacco (Chairman of the Transportation Committee and Mayor of North Bergen), Cunningham (Senate Majority Whip) and Holzapfel (Republican Member of the Senate Transportation Committee.

U.S. Senator Robert Menendez recently was quoted in the newspaper as being outraged and questioned why there was a lack of federal enforcement, since jitney-buses were crossing state lines without proper authority and insurance. At the request of LANJ President Tim Rose, LANJ is now working with the Senator and his staff. A conference call with the Senator's Legislative Counsel and Transportation Aide has been set up for September 4th to discuss the issue and how the Federal Government needs to address this serious problem. This may require LANJ working with the US Secretary of Transportation Donovan.
