NLA Registers Industry Support for Legislation Forgiving PPP Loans of Less Than \$150,000

The National Limousine Association (NLA), of which the Limousine Association of New Jersey is a member, has joined more than 100 other trade associations representing thousands of small businesses to support S. 4117, the **Paycheck Protection Program Small Business Forgiveness Act**.

As described in a July 9, 2020 letter sent to the chairs and ranking members of the U.S. Senate Committee on Small Business & Entrepreneurship and the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Small Business, the trade associations "urge Congress to quickly pass this legislation that would forgive PPP loans of less than \$150,000 upon the borrower's completion of a simple, one-page forgiveness document."

The letter further explains that "PPP loans of \$150,000 and under account for 85 percent of total PPP recipients, but less than 27 percent of PPP loan dollars. Expediting the loan forgiveness process for many...hard-hit businesses will save more than \$7 billion dollars and hours of paperwork."

The PuraArmor enterprise was founded by chauffeured transportation veterans **Shawn Glasgow** of Peak Limousine (Charlotte, N.C.) and **Eric Devlin** of Premier Transportation (Dallas, Tex.) and industry sales professional **Brian O'Neill**.

Says O'Neill, "It's about giving customers peace of mind that the vehicle was germ-free prior to them getting in. This is a product that applies to the masses, including residential applications, because it's safe to use around anyone."
